



## Sports and PE Premium Expenditure

### Review and impact of Spend 22/2023

- PE Grant Income £17, 580
- Grant Expenditure Curriculum Course £15, 500
- SSP Membership to access Interschool Competition £1830
- Curriculum Programme of Study and CPD: £200

In total 20% of weekly curriculum time at The Free School Norwich is allocated to PE and sports activities. Each day the school also has a 15 minute break in the morning and 60 minute break at lunch time for physical activities outside.

The number of children who took part in physical activities is as follows:

- PE lessons at NCFC Carrow Road Sports Park (KS2) 100%
- PE lessons on site with PE specialist (KS1) 100%
- Multi-Skills festivals and competitive events 48%

The current range of PE and sporting activities on offer at The Free School Norwich is sustainable due to the following factors:

- The school's established links with a wide range of primary school PE and sports providers in the local community.
- The school has a qualified sports teacher who is able to deliver many of the listed PE and sports activities as part of the curriculum.
