Dear Parents,

#### Welcome Back!

We'd like to welcome you all back for another school year in particular to our new parents for children starting with us for the first time. As always, we understand that the start of a new school year can be tricky, remembering the routines and knowing what has changed, so please don't worry about asking us if you have any questions.

#### Reminders

Please can you make sure that all clothing, including coats, is named so that we can return it to the right person if it gets lost. Please also ensure that your child has a school tie and a pair of black school shoes. Trainers, unless it is a PE day, are not permitted.

We show parents what their children have been learning on Tapestry. This is primarily for recording observations of children's learning and is not a communication tool. Staff do not check this for messages, so if you need to contact them directly please contact the main office at <a href="mailto:office@freeschoolnorwich.org.uk">office@freeschoolnorwich.org.uk</a> and it will be passed over to the class teacher.

As the weather gets colder, please ensure that your child brings a coat to school as we will continue to do outside activities even if it is cold or slightly wet.

At the end of the day, school staff will only release your child when they make eye contact with you. Children have been asked not to play with the playground toys at the end of the day as they can get lost or damaged at this time. Please could you support us to reinforce this rule.

#### **Medications**

We understand that, from time to time, children will require medicines to be administered in school. If you child needs medication during the school day please come and fill in a form in the main office so that we can ensure it is given correctly. Please note we are only allowed to administer prescribed medications.

# **Reading at Home**

We ask that you read on a daily basis with your child, for a minimum of 10 minutes. All evidence shows that this will help your children make the

best progress with their reading. This should be recorded in your child's reading record for Years R-5. Class teachers will monitor these. We would also like all children to take part in their Year groups Reading Quest. See below for more details.

# **Reading Quest**

We are encouraging all children to take part in our exciting reading venture, the FSN Reading Quest. Reading continues to be at the heart of our curriculum and we want to encourage all our children to develop a lifelong love of reading.

Each child will be challenged to read 5 Fiction, 5 Non-Fiction and 10 Independent Choice books over the course of the academic year. The books can be sourced from your child's class reading corner, our fantastic library, or your local library. Following completion of each book your child will need to complete a short activity to demonstrate their engagement with the book. Your child will bring home a pack with more information and activity ideas.

Every child who completes the FSN Reading Quest will receive a personalised certificate presented in assembly, alongside the knowledge and reward that they are striving to be thriving readers!

## **Book Bags**

We are asking for all parents to please ensure you provide a book bag for your child, school branded book bags can be purchased from Stevensons, although any book bag will be fine. These should help to protect our beautiful books as well as the environment.

Please can we ask that book bags are clearly labelled with your child's name and that they are only used for your child's reading books and hear me diaries, no water bottles please!

# **Spellings**

You will receive a set of weekly spellings on Tapestry to practice with your child. Spelling

remains a key skill for successful writing and accurate vocabulary building.
